Advanced Lung Disease

With a diagnosis of advanced lung disease comes a heavy symptom burden that can make daily life more difficult.

- Weight loss
- Other chronic conditions, such as diabetes, dementia, heart or kidney disease
- Difficulty with daily activities like dressing, bathing, or walking
- Needing oxygen regularly or needing more than before
- Feeling tired, weak, or uncomfortable
